Description: The Zeithain prisoner of war (POW) camp was established in 1941 by the Nazi regime, to accommodate Soviet POW's. Due to malnutrition, disease, insufficient medical treatment and terrible conditions approximately 30,000 POWs died. Their living conditions did not comply with the rules of the Geneva Convention and it was one of the biggest war crimes committed by the German armed forces. From 1943 there were also prisoners from other countries including Italy, Poland, Yugoslavia, France and the UK. Since 2003, volunteers, under the supervision of an archaeologist, have worked on uncovering the

Work: Volunteers will work on creating a "history trail" on the site of the former Zeithain camp. The work will involve landscaping and gardening and hopefully some construction work. Depending on weather conditions, conservation and documentation of objects found at the site may also be done.

Location: Zeithain is a small town in Saxony, near Riesa am Elbe which is known for the history of the POW-camp and the link-up of the Red Army and the US Army in April 1945.
