Project Description:

The objective of this project is to give priority attention to safe lives of these abandoned and innocent babies / children who have destiny and greater fulfillment in future. The children are product of early pregnancy that could not prevail on the irate decision of their parents to terminate their destiny. These children are not only picked on the streets, waste disposal or ready to be destroyed but for the sake of this Home to regain and secure their rights back to life becomes very vital to the society. The expected results is that volunteer would have created an impact into the society.

Detailed Information:

Work: The project is a Child Care Centre called Ijamido Children Home (i.e. Children and Motherless Home) located in the heart of Sango Otta town in Ogun

State. Train and mentor some children of the home with good conduct and become role model in the society. The volunteer will also have learnt social and intercultural exchange in the environment. Deposit acceptable values and norms as experienced in the western world.

Requirements: Bring some info of personal health material like how to brush teeth, washing hands, cutting nails, etc. Volunteers can also arrange cultural exchange, gardening, sport activities, making wall magazine, etc.

Food: The organization provides the local food materials and ingredients. Volunteers will do self-catering in a local kitchen together with local volunteers. The meal provided is general for all volunteers but optional meal is at volunteer's expense.

Accommodation: Volunteers will be accommodated in room - dormitories existing in the Farm. The farm camp is big and has accommodation facilities with all conveniences. Bathroom and toilet facilities are also available.

Pocket money: Arrange by volunteer

Insurance: Kindly obtain your Health Insurance for appropriate months of stay before departure.

Fees: \$250 (US) Dollar, 200 euro or 150.00 British Pound for the camp. Please note that the amount mentioned here is charged per month for STV/MTV/LTV Volunteers to Nigeria as participation fees.

Visa: Please note: Business Visa should be obtained for 3 months but less than 6 months stay. If stay is more than 6 months, STR Visa should be collected before departure. Tourist Visa is only allowed for 1 month.

Others: Source of Water Clean water is sometimes available through pipe-borne facilities but not always. But most often water is collected from borehole, streams, rivers or water tank. Volunteers usually boiled this water for safe drinking. Fee: 200euro is charged per month

In the SCI french branch office, the PO is in charge of recruiting and communicating with french volunteers going to workcamps abroad and foreign volunteers coming to french workcamps. The PO will be able to enjoy an international working atmosphere, discovering different solidarity-based projects, discover the

world of SCI and its many possibilities... He/she will work with great colleagues eager to meet her/him!

Detailed Information:

Work: The placement officer will start working with SCI France the 1st of march. He/she will be introduced to the team and work environment. He/she will take part in the PO training (a week in march in a SCI branch abroad, to be determined). Upon his/her return, He/she will start the recruitment process : filling in placement sheets, answering volunteers, communicating on what volunteering and workcamps are, what international solidarity is, organizing events/parties once a month to get to know our volunteers before their departure and their impressions once they're back. He/she will also help the permanent team with writing infosheets statistics at the end of the season. The PO will also join the Workcamp Leader Training in april and will lead a workcamp or two during the summer time (july/august). The working hours are from monday to friday from 10 to 18 PM. Twice a month, there are late evenings and there will be a few working week-ends during the working period (march, april main)

Requirements: * good french and good english ! * good understanding of volunteering * flexibility towards working hours * capacity to work autonomously and seriously * good IT skills * excellent communication skills to motivate the volunteers * open attitude to interculturality, peace issues. and environmental awareness.

Work: It is hoped that volunteers will help the team in the kitchen and dining room; help with cleaning and preparation of bedrooms and meeting rooms and some decorating and gardening. Volunteers will also work on reception greeting guests; assist the wardens in the running of some of the events in the House, e.g. senior citizens weeks, walking weeks; and join in the work camp in the summer. 40 hours per week; two days off per week, which may or may not Saturday and Sunday; two days holiday per month.

Requirements: Reasonable proficiency in English and reasonable confidence in relating to and communicating with people. Flexibility and willingness to work and experience or skill in do-it-yourself tasks, including gardening, painting and decorating also required. Volunteers must be willing to share living accommodation (separate bedrooms) and work closely with another volunteer. Christian faith is not a requirement, but would be welcome. Openness to people of different faiths and commitments is necessary.

Food: The volunteers will normally have meals with groups using the House. When there are no guests, food will be provided and the volunteers will be responsible for their own cooking.

Accommodation: The volunteers will occupy a small flat in a wing of the main building. The volunteer will share a room with a shared common room and toilet/shower room.

Pocket money: 33.00 pounds per week

VIA Netherlands is the Dutch branch of SCI. Each year we organise around 6 workcamps and send out app. 90 volunteers to projects all over the world. Besides this we are involved in the LTEG work of SCI, the work concerning former Yugoslavia, the Middle East and Central Asia. Our organisation is completely run by volunteers. At the moment about 40 volunteers make some voluntary effort, of who about 15 regularly come into the office. Our office is located in a former hospital building in Amsterdam, which was once squatted but is now legal. We share the building with app 40 other organisations.

Detailed Information:

Work: The LTV is responsible for incoming and outgoing placements and other office tasks. Later in the season there is the possibility of co-ordinating a Dutch workcamp. The LTV is expected to work 6 hours a day, 5 days a week and sometimes in weekend. The LTV needs to work independently. Many volunteers occasionally come to the office and give some help. This structure means on one hand the LTV is going to work together with and meet a lot of nice and enthu-

siastic VIA volunteers. On the other hand it means that the LTV needs to have a sense of responsibility and self-initiative, because there is nobody ordering the LTV what to do all the time.

Requirements: Good computer skills (MS Office), enthusiasm, flexibility, self-initiative and an open attitude for new experiences in life. We expect the LTV to attend the Placement Officer Training before the project starts. Date and place are not yet known.

Food: The LTV will have pocketmoney to buy food.

Accommodation: Provided by VIA Netherlands. Somewhere in Amsterdam, a private room or shared apartment. Not necessarily in the same place all the time.

Project Description:

We are a community of 60 people on 300 acres of woodlands and fields with a river running through, located about 90 km north of Toronto. We have 6 houses with up to 10 people in each. Recently we acquired a house in the Large city of Barrie, approximately 25 minutes away. We hope to build up an urban day centre there. We are a life sharing community. We live and work together helping each other where needed. Our involvement with each other is like a family, which means from morning to evening. One of the challenges is to be aware of each other's needs and to help each other to meet them.

Detailed Information:

Work: There would be possibilities to do domestic work, cooking, and helping the disabled adults with their daily routine, etc. You may also find yourself working in one of the workshops - weavery, woodshop, and bakery or in the summer

food processing. We also have a farm, a garden, maple syrup production, forestry, general land maintenance and a small store.

Requirements: Sensitivity to the needs of others, willingness to offer some physical care for people with special needs, driver's license (not required but it helps). Everyone is expected to support all aspects of our life including the religious and cultural expressions. must speak at least intermediate English

Food: provided

Accommodation: in the houses, usually a private room, shared bath

Pocket money: monthly. You will also get some money for vacation if you are here for a year.

Insurance: provided after 3 months

Fees: none for volunteers from abroad \$100.00 to SCI-LTV-USA for US volunteers

Others: Our life is inspired by Anthroposophy and Christianity as developed by Rudolf Steiner. We have an ongoing adult education program for our entire community plus an orientation program throughout the Fall and Winter season for new volunteers, based on an introduction to Anthroposophy and the philosophy of Camphill. The orientation course starts the beginning of October. Canada has a very extreme and challenging climate. It is wonderful to experience the four very dramatic seasons.

Project Description:

American Conservation Experience is a volunteer program for both international and American participants who want to make a difference in their world. ACE is grounded in the philosophy that international understanding and goodwill can

be achieved through cooperative labor on meaningful conservation projects . By attracting a corps of conservation-minded volunteers, ACE contributes to the breakdown of cultural barriers while advancing ecological awareness on a global scale.

Detailed Information:

Work: ACE volunteers come from many nations around the world to work in small teams on direct service projects for the National Forest Service, National Park Service and other land management agencies throughout Arizona, southern Nevada, and southern Utah. Typical projects include trail construction and maintenance, native plant revegetation, exotic species removal, fence construction, erosion control, and wilderness restoration.
